
The Ningbo Museum features his choice of materials with a stark contrast to the concrete slanted walls that make up the structure. Some of the materials used are recycled terracotta and clay which were salvaged from the demolition sites of olden day buildings. Because these pieces are used within the Ningbo Museum, it brings about a decorative random element, and a connection and confrontation to the historic past of the materials used. Wang Shu himself describes the building as a sort of hill or mountain, which connects back to the idea of utilizing the topology and the shape of the land. Concrete slanted walls give this monolith form, and the museum is organized around two central masses.
